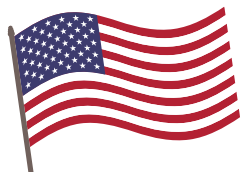
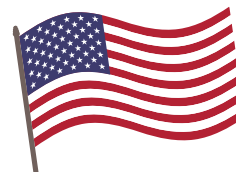

Cicero, and others, were successful in getting Post 173 chartered as an American Legion Post. Named the Holiday Bicentennial Post at the time of charter, with Cicero being the Post's first Commander. Unfortunately, Michael Cicero would take ill and pass away in April of 1976. The Post Members voted to rename the Post in his honor, so April

2026 is the 50th Anniversary of Michael J. Cicero Post 173. We plan to celebrate this anniversary in April, so look for the flyers. We also have T-shirts on sale to commemorate 50 great years of Veterans strengthen America!

As we start the year off, several improvements are coming to our Post home. We will still be supporting our Veterans and our community, but our home needs some TLC! We will be adding a new LED programable outside sign. Construction should start second week of January. It will go in the middle flower bed behind the motorcycle parking. We are having the flat roof over the back of the Post and kitchen replaced and some soffit repaired. As we finish the painting of the inside, we will start installing new ceiling tiles and we are looking at all new flooring throughout the Post. We are also going to get the outside of the building painted and look at a mural to celebrate our Veterans across the front and side of the building. Sorry for any inconvenience these projects may cause, just be patient with us as we are making these improvements.

With the New Year in full swing, the Post will be back out helping our community. We will continue our support of children and youth programs through several small, but important community projects. We will continue our support of the Holiday Recreation Center by again sponsoring youth volleyball and basketball programs through the Winter months. The Post continues its support of Steps to Recovery program with a monthly dinner for one of their meetings. Steps to Recovery has VA sponsorship to support Veterans, but the program will not turn away a member of our community who is trying to improve their life. At the Post, we are always looking for Veteran projects to support and will continue our support of the One Community Now Stand Down in the spring. Stand Down is a community wide push to help Veterans, and homeless Vets, in need of medical, dental and legal issues, along with

counseling and spiritual guidance.

As we move into the New Year, the Post will start recruiting and interviewing potential candidates for the American Legion Boys State program in Tallahassee for the Summer 2026 session. Our plan is to send three qualified candidates. The American Legion Boys State is a selective educational program of government instructions for U.S. High School students. It is a participatory program where the students become part of a local, county and state government to better understand how our country works. Boys State is a Nation Wide American Legion Program, conducted by each State American Legion Department. Boys State was founded in 1935. The Auxiliary has a similar program called Girl's State. It is always great to see these youth take an interest in America and how our government works.

There are numerous other programs the Post Legion Family does throughout the year. The Riders will work Project Vet Relief- Suicide Prevention, the SAL annually donates to Special Olympics, and the Auxiliary does their Red Poppy Drive in the Spring. Last, but not least will be our continued support of Dogs Inc service dogs and all the great work they do for Veterans in need.

Our Social Quarters is our biggest source of funds to support the programs mentioned above. We will have our entertainment and games, as always, but there will be special events throughout the year that we will have a flyer in the Post, or it will be on our social media feeds. Not trying to wish the year away already, but you know we will have something special for the Super Bowl, Valentine's Day Dinner, and of course ST Patty's Day, so plan on being part of the fun and support the Post.

In closing, I hope everybody is ready to make 2026 another great year at Post 173. Your continued support of the American Legion and our Post allow us to help our community and Veterans.

Heads Up, Florida Riders—The Gang Law is Too Broad

Listen up, folks. As your Director, I need to talk to you about something serious that affects every single rider in Florida—especially us in

the American Legion Riders. There's this state law, and some proposed changes, that are way too broad when they define "criminal gang members" and "associates."

The intent of laws like Florida Statute Section 874.03 and the proposed changes in Florida House Bill 429 (HB 429) is to help law enforcement take down



actual criminal gangs. We get that. But the problem is, the language is so vague and messy that it could inadvertently sweep up any of us law-abiding motorcycle enthusiasts.

Right now, to be considered a "criminal gang member," you only have to meet two or more criteria from a list. HB 429 is looking to expand that list and, in some cases, make the threshold even lower. **What's the Big Deal for Regular Riders?**

The real danger is in the subjective criteria that basically just describe normal biker culture:

★ **How We Dress:** This is the biggest headache. Our "uniform"—leather jackets, vests (cuts), and patches like our American Legion Post patches, U.S. flags, or POW/MIA symbols—is a part of our shared



culture. It's not a criminal uniform! The law makes it tough for a cop on the street to tell the difference between the specific "colors" of a genuine outlaw club and the patches of non-criminal groups like ours, other veterans' associations, or touring clubs.

★ Who We Associate

With: The current law says you have to be seen with known gang members four or more times. HB 429 wants to cut that down to just two times. Think about it: at a big public event like Bike Week, or even at a popular biker bar or restaurant, it is ridiculously easy to be in the same room as someone who later gets identified as a gang member. You won't know their business, but you could still be counted as an "associate."

A Call to Action

These laws are used to dramatically increase penalties if a person commits an offense—they're sentencing enhancements. Being a part of the American Legion Riders is not a crime, but the risk is that law-abiding folks, including our own chapter members, could be unfairly targeted, profiled, or placed into a gang database based on a broad interpretation of what we wear



or where we hang out.

We have to stay informed about how these laws are written. We need to advocate for clear language that separates real criminal activity from our shared, non-criminal passion for riding.

Stay vigilant, know your rights, and let's protect the integrity and image of our organization.
